I am in awe of the resourcefulness and creativity of the St. Helen's staff team. The 'Inspiring Change-makers' character education research project that teachers have collaboratively developed and delivered for all children, both at home and in school, is truly inspiring.

I have been impressed every day by the children's approach to this project and how they are already developing their moral, civic, intellectual and performance character virtues.

This half term we began introducing The Alumnis Character Education Programme through the 'Global Explorers' mini projects. Last week's mini project was 'Peaceful Paths' and this week's is 'Little Homes'. Next week, the project will be 'Maps for New Friends'. Through these projects, the children have developed an increasing awareness of the United Nations Sustainable Goals; begun to consider big ideas such as sustainability, equality, community, poverty, innovation, infrastructure and industry; and have developed character virtues such as empathy, problem-solving, creativity, curiosity and communication. It has been really exciting to see the wide range of outcomes that these projects have inspired, and the creative solutions that our children have come up with should make us all feel very hopeful for the future! COVID-19 Symptoms

We ask that everyone is extra vigilant to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. We ask that any parent, carer or child with any of the following symptoms stays at home and gets a test.

Symptoms:

- new continuous cough
- temperature
- loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

Please do not come to the school for a 14-day period from the onset of initial symptoms unless a negative test result is obtained.

Children MUST NOT attend school if they or anyone in their household has tested positive in the last 10 days. If your child is displaying symptoms please keep them at home for 10 days while siblings and the rest of the household self-isolates for 14 days.

If a positive case is confirmed, then the 'bubble' including adults may need to self isolate, depending on Public Health advice. St. Helen's CoE School will follow all Public Health guidance to maximise safety.
