

Year 6 Curriculum Overview Spring 2021

English: Children have taken part in whole school writing projects incorporating a range of genre and differentiated by the spelling, punctuation and grammar rules appropriate to the year group.

Genres include narrative, poetry, persuasive writing/balanced argument, information text and instructional writing.

Spellings have focused on the Year 5 and 6 statutory spelling list.

Oracy focuses on speaking to educate, inform and persuade through the Global Goals Explorers project.

PSHE: We follow the Coram SCARF programme, which supports a growth mindset approach to learning. This term, units focus on "Keeping Myself Safe" and "Rights and Responsibilities"

PE: Children take part in a range of socially distanced sporting activities, including running, skipping, and dance.

Maths: Following the White Rose programme of study, children will work on units including:

Multiplication and division (including factors, multiples, primes, square numbers, cube numbers, area models of multiplication, formal written methods)

Decimals

Ratio

Fractions

Statistics

Percentages

Metric measures

Perimeter, area and volume

A daily focus on Times Tables and basic mental arithmetic skills.

Cross curricular maths will be used to link maths to our wider themes.

Science: The children have taken part in STEM challenges linked to the UN Sustainable (Global Goals). They are encouraged to seek opportunities to find solutions to global issues, drawing on the national curriculum programme of study knowledge and skills for their year group.

Enrichment: Simple Politics sessions, CGP books, IXL and MANGA HIGH activities, Daily Physical Activity, British Sign Language

The Arts: The children take part in a range of creative arts activities linked to the Global Goals – Inspiring Change Makers

History and Geography: Children independently researched a range of geographical and historical concepts in the context of their independent research project.

Learning in geography focuses specifically on Uganda, and ensures children draw comparisons between local, national and global situations as well as changes over time.
