First Mini School News

Academic: This week the children in Reception have started learning their Phase 2 Phonics with Bug Club, they have enjoyed singing along with Bug and have already demonstrated some great resourcefulness in noticing the sounds that they have learned during their learning throughout the day. In Year 1, Rupert, Aiva, Fletcher have worked really hard on Phase 5 using great critical thinking and decision making skills to identify the correct graphemes in their writing.

Character: Our Character Virtue focus for this half term is 'compassion', the children have been learning about what this means and have already been telling us about other children they have seen showing compassion towards them or others. 'Enise showed compassion when she asked Bethan if she would like to hold her hand when she was looking sad because she missed her sister.' 'Eve has been noticing when children have needed extra help this week or they just need a friend.'

Community: The children in the First Mini School have enjoyed welcoming their families into our school for the first time! We had a wonderful walk exploring some of our local environment and seeing some of the important places in our community, followed by a lovely cream tea and a tour of the school. **Innovation:** Year 1 have been using the iPads to tinker with an app called Pettson's inventions to explore cause and effect. Reception have been using the Vtech cameras to take pictures of each other and showing great confidence in exploring the learning apps on our class iPads.

Middle Mini School News

Academic: All 3 year groups have begun studying their core texts for the term, all of which focus on the theme of Social Justice - Valuing All God's Children. I have been lucky to hear some incredible conversations showing compassion and empathy for children who find themselves fleeing their homes to escape war, poverty or injustice. It has also been really motivational for the children to bring their bespoke learning books home so that you can see what they have been learning and comment on their successes. Thanks for your support with this!

Character: In Character Education this week, we applied our critical thinking skills to the Jo Cox quote, "We are more united and have more in common than that which divides us." We considered all the things that bring us together and the children came up with some amazing ideas, including: faith, friendship, family, learning, sharing, and humanity.

Community: The children have enjoyed practising the hymns for our harvest festival next Tuesday. We are excited to be going to church after what feels like a very long time. Due to their COVID risk assessments, the wardens have asked us to restrict attendance to pupils and staff at the moment, but donations of non-perishable food items would be greatly appreciated. They will be given to Harbour to help feed those who are struggling.

Innovation: The children have been creatively exploring the theme for this year's Spirited Arts RE competition, the theme of which is the Jo Cox quote above. They have begun thinking about how they can express this idea through images. Additionally, some enterprising Year 4 students will be running a tuck shop on the netball court on Friday's after school to raise funds for FOSH (Friends of St Helen's - our PTA)



Upper Mini School News

Academic: A busy week in both Y5&Y6 this week in maths. Y5 have been enjoying the challenge of Roman numerals and Year 6 have been mastering their understanding of negative numbers. In science this week Y6 have looked at (and eaten) phases of using Oreos. Year 5 have been learning about the planets.

Character education: Y5 have been inspiring skills builders this week, visiting The Burton Art Gallery to practise portrait drawing. One of our parent helpers said this about the trip,
