Community updates:

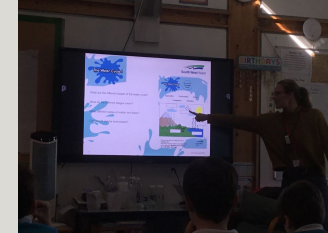
